## SUSTAINABILITY POLICY

### Objective:

To implement practices that promote environmental sustainability and reduce the organization's carbon footprint, ensuring that all operations align with the organization's commitment to environmental stewardship, in accordance with the *UN's SDGs, particularly SDG 12 (Responsible Consumption and Production) and SDG 13 (Climate Action)*.

### Policy:

- Reduce Carbon Footprint:
  - Energy Efficiency: Implement energy-efficient practices in all facilities, in alignment with *SDG 7 (Affordable and Clean Energy)*. This includes using energy-saving lighting, appliances, and heating/cooling systems. Regularly audit energy use to identify and address inefficiencies.
